Belinda A. Barnett is a Senior Counsel for the Antitrust Division's Deputy Assistant Attorney General for Criminal Enforcement, Scott Hammond. Ms. Barnett advises senior Division officials on cartel cases and related policy matters. Ms. Barnett was a co-author of the 2008 Frequently Asked Questions Regarding the Antitrust Division's Leniency Program and Model Leniency Letters, a comprehensive and updated resource on recurring issues regarding the implementation of the Division's Corporate Leniency and Individual Leniency Policies.

Ms. Barnett has served as a Vice-Chair of the Cartel and Criminal Practice Committee of the Section of Antitrust Law of the American Bar Association since 2006. She was an author and a primary editor of the second edition of the Section's Criminal Antitrust Litigation Handbook published in 2006 and is currently a primary editor of the Section's upcoming Leniency and Sentencing Handbook.

Prior to becoming Senior Counsel, Ms. Barnett was a Special Assistant for the Antitrust Division's Directors of Merger, Civil Non-Merger, and Criminal Enforcement in Washington, D.C. from 1998-2000. In that position, she advised senior Division officials on criminal and civil antitrust investigations and cases and served as the Division's clearance liaison with the Federal Trade Commission. From 1990-1998, Ms. Barnett was a staff attorney in the Antitrust Division's Atlanta, Georgia Field Office, where her work focused on domestic and international criminal antitrust investigations and prosecutions involving price fixing, bid rigging, and market allocations.

Ms. Barnett received her undergraduate degree in mathematics *summa cum laude* from the University of Alabama and her law degree from the University of Alabama School of Law, where she was a member of the *Alabama Law Review* and Order of the Coif.
