

Michael Bloom, Federal Trade Commission

Michael Joel Bloom is an Assistant Director of the Bureau of Competition of the Federal Trade Commission, where he leads the Office of Policy and Coordination. He has practiced antitrust law in the corporate and government sectors, providing counsel to business leaders at Westinghouse Electric and Xerox Corporations and providing policy guidance and litigating to prevent or redress anticompetitive conduct in a variety of positions with the Federal Trade Commission, including, in addition to his present posting, as Director of Litigation of the Bureau of Competition and as Director of its New York Region Office.

Mr. Bloom is a frequent lecturer on antitrust law and on trial practice skills, regularly serving on the faculty of the National Institute for Trial Advocacy. In addition to his domestic work, Mr. Bloom has served as a technical adviser to competition and consumer protection authorities abroad. Mr. Bloom is admitted to the bars of Pennsylvania, New York, and the Supreme Court of the United States, among others.
