

## **RACHEL BRANDENBURGER**

Rachel Brandenburger was appointed Special Advisor, International to the Assistant Attorney General for Antitrust Division of the United States Department of Justice in January 2010.

Prior to her appointment, Rachel Brandenburger was a partner in Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer LLP for 21 years, working in the firm's Antitrust, Competition and Trade Group in Brussels and London. She also co-led the firm's Telecommunications, Media and Technology Regulatory Group for a number of years and, more recently, served on the firm's Partner Recommendation Committee.

In her practice, she advised many companies doing business on both sides of the Atlantic and globally, and led cases in front of both the European Commission and the UK and other national competition and regulatory authorities in Europe. Her major cases included investigations into mergers, anti-competitive practices, dominant positions and cartels by the European Commission and the national authorities in Europe and internationally. She has also advised on litigation proceedings in the UK and before the European courts in Luxembourg.

She has been listed as a leading antitrust and regulatory lawyer in many guides and directories and named as one of the top 20 antitrust lawyers globally. She was appointed as the only non-US member of the ABA Antitrust Section's 2008-09 Presidential Transition Report Task Force and has also been a member of the ABA Antitrust Section's International Task Force, the IBA's Extraterritorial Jurisdiction Task Force and the UK Department of Trade and Industry's Panel of Experts on the Modernization of EU law.

She is a frequent speaker on antitrust and regulatory issues, and is the author or co-author of many papers and publications concerning antitrust and regulatory law, as well as a member of various editorial boards.

She has an M.A. in Jurisprudence from the University of Oxford, England.
