Michael A. Carrier is a Professor of Law at Rutgers University School of Law - Camden. He has published and spoken widely on the antitrust and intellectual property laws. His book, *Innovation for the 21st Century: Harnessing the Power of Intellectual Property and Antitrust Law*, was published by Oxford University Press in 2009, and he is the editor of the forthcoming volume, *Critical Concepts in Intellectual Property Law: Competition* (Edward Elgar Publishing 2010). Professor Carrier's work has appeared in the Stanford Law Review, Michigan Law Review, University of Pennsylvania Law Review, Duke Law Journal, Vanderbilt Law Review, Minnesota Law Review, Iowa Law Review, and Yale Law Journal Pocket Part. Before entering academia, he clerked for the Honorable John D. Butzner, Jr. on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, and practiced antitrust, intellectual property, and sports law at Covington & Burling, in Washington, D.C. Professor Carrier is a summa cum laude graduate of Yale University and a cum laude graduate of Michigan Law School, where he was Book Review Editor of the Michigan Law Review.
