

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT
OF
JUDGE PAUL L. FRIEDMAN

Paul L. Friedman is a judge on the United States District Court for the District of Columbia. Before taking the oath of office on August 1, 1994, he was a partner in the firm of White & Case and the managing partner of its Washington, D.C. office. Judge Friedman was law clerk to Judge Roger Robb on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit and to Judge Aubrey E. Robinson, Jr., on the U.S. District Court. He was an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Columbia, an Assistant to the Solicitor General of the United States, and Associate Independent Counsel for the Iran/Contra Investigation. Judge Friedman is a Past President of the District of Columbia Bar and chaired the U.S. District Court Civil Justice Reform Act Advisory Group, the D.C. Judicial Nomination Commission, and the U.S. District Court Grievance Committee. He is a member of the American Law Institute, its Council, and the Executive Committee of the Council; he chairs the ALI's Program Committee and is an advisor to its Model Penal Code Sentencing Project. He is also a member of the American Academy of Appellate Lawyers and a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers. He served on the American Bar Association Special Commission on Multidisciplinary Practice and is a Fellow of the American Bar Foundation.
