

Bob Herndon was a CPA prior to joining the FBI. Mr. Herndon has been an FBI Special Agent for 23 years. He was the case Agent on three well known white collar crime cases and he worked undercover for three years on a national security matter. The white collar crime cases consisted of a federal judge who was convicted on bribery charges, a pharmacist who diluted chemotherapy drugs for stage 4 and stage 5 cancer patients, and an international price fixing investigation that became the subject of a best selling book and a major motion picture called The Informant. Mr. Herndon received the Attorney General's Distinguished Service award for his work on the ADM investigation, was named the Agent of the Year in Kansas City for his work on the pharmacist investigation, and received the National Intelligence Meritorious Citation from the Director of the CIA for his undercover assignment. Mr. Herndon is currently the Acting Supervisor of the White Collar Crime Squad in the Kansas City Division of the FBI.
