

## NIALL E. LYNCH

Niall E. Lynch, is Assistant Chief in the San Francisco Field Office of the Antitrust Division, United States Department of Justice. He has experience in both civil and criminal matters. Currently, Mr. Lynch is the lead attorney in the Division's ongoing grand jury investigation into the Liquid Crystal Display market. He also lead or assisted several of the Division's prosecutions of international price-fixing conspiracies including DRAM, citric acid, hydrogen peroxide, and sodium gluconate. The cases Mr. Lynch has lead have resulted in dozens of corporate and individual prosecutions and criminal fines well over \$1 billion.

On the civil side, Mr. Lynch has worked on a variety of merger matters in the high-technology area, including as lead attorney in the Division's merger review of JDS Uniphase and SDL, Inc., which lead to a \$3 billion divestiture of assets.

Mr. Lynch is currently the Vice-Chairman of the ABA Antitrust Section's Compliance and Ethics Committee, and was previously Vice-Chairman of the Criminal Practice and Procedure Committee.

From 1997 to 1998, Mr. Lynch was assigned to the United States Attorney's Office, Criminal Division for the Northern District of California as a Special Assistant United States Attorney. During that time, Mr. Lynch prosecuted and tried several criminal cases in the General Crimes Section.

Mr. Lynch graduated from the University of California, Berkeley in 1986 with a degree in Political Science. He received his J.D. in 1991 from Hastings College of the Law. After graduating from law school, Mr. Lynch clerked for the Honorable Edward J. Schwartz of the United States District Court for the Southern District of California.
