ABOUT THE PROJECT

The American Bar Association Death Penalty Representation Project works to address the crisis of counsel in the death penalty system. As one of its primary goals, the Project seeks to expand the pool of lawyers willing to serve as pro bono counsel for Death Row inmates in post-conviction proceedings by recruiting competent volunteer attorneys to handle capital cases and providing training and assistance to them. The Project also works to educate the public and bar about the crisis of counsel and to reform the systems that provide lawyers to indigent defendants through systemic litigation and implementation of ABA policy.

Each year the Project celebrates its dedicated volunteers at our Anniversary & Volunteer Recognition Event. - Role of the firm and team members, including resources devoted to the case and level of participation; and
- Impact of the nominee's achievements for the client or the community, or the development of law in the jurisdiction.

You are also welcome to include any other supporting documents with the Letter of Nomination, including newspaper clippings, media publicity, or information about other recognition received for the work.

Please note that there is not a page limit for submitted materials. Honorees are selected by an Awards Committee, which does not include Project staff.
