Snowshoe Tours

Half Day Nature Tour: Just like a peaceful hike in the woods, except that we enjoy it in the snow! Join our guides today for a snowshoe nature tour. You will learn the fundamentals of snow shoeing as you visit a scenic nature trail to learn about the natural environment with a professional guide. Great for all levels and ages. Your tour includes, snowshoes, poles, pack, hot cocoa and snack, and transportation. **The afternoon trip departs at 1:00 PM. Cost: \$89 per person based on a minimum of 4 people. \$315 for the private rate of 1-3 guests. Tour includes transportation, equipment, drinks & snacks but not guide gratuity.**

What should I Wear? Dress in layers based on the weather. These may include long underwear for your legs, zip neck top, synthetic sweater or vest, light to heavy ski socks, mittens or warm gloves, hat, lighter weight ski pants and wind shells or jacket. Exercise clothes with a light jacket and shell pants are also a good option. You will need hiking boots or a winter boot.

What should I bring? Sunglasses and goggles, sunscreen & camera if desired. We will provide a daypack.

Snowmobile Tours: Guide gratuities have not been included

2 Hour Ride to Maroon Bells – Ride your snowmobile all the way to Maroon Lake at the base of the most photographed peaks in North America – the Maroon Bells. Enjoy a snack at the Lake then cruise over miles of groomed trails through Aspen groves and wide-open meadows. **Starting times are 9:00 AM, 11:30 AM and 2:30 PM. Transfer on own. T Lazy 7 will pick you up from the bus stop at the Aspen Highlands. Cost: \$200 Single Sled/ \$150 per person double sled.**

2 1/2 Hour Klondike Lunch Tour to Maroon Bells– Tour the White River National Forest for a spectacular visit to Maroon Lake and the Maroon Bells – the “most photographed peaks in North America.” The Klondike Cabin, with its panoramic view of the 14,000-foot Pyramid Peak, will be our headquarters for a lunch of burgers with all the fixin’s. **Starting times are 9:30 AM and 12:30 PM. Transfer on own. T Lazy 7 will pick you up from the bus stop at the Aspen Highlands. Cost: \$220 Single Sled/ \$165 per person double sled.**

2 Hour Adventure On Larkspur Mountain – It’s fast, it’s exciting, it will take your breath away! Find yourself in the backcountry as you drive your snowmobile above Woody Creek on a great Western Adventure. Includes hot drinks. **Western Adventures will pick you up from the bus stop at Brush Creek & Hwy 82. Tours start at 9:00 AM or 1:00 PM. Cost: \$190 Single Sled/ \$140 per person double sled.**

3 Hour Adventure to Silver Park – Fun and Fast! The views only get better the longer you spend on this tour on Larkspur Mountain above Woody Creek. Enjoy yourself among evergreens and aspen groves contrasted by

deep white snow. Includes lunch. **Tours start at 9:00 AM or 11:00 AM. Western Adventures will pick you up from the bus stop at Brush Creek & Hwy 82. Cost: \$240 Single Sled/ \$155 per person double sled.**

4 Hour Kobey Park – This extensive tour offers guests the chance to open up their machines and test their abilities, view local elk herds, and take in the pristine beauty this area offers. The ride up Larkspur Mountain is only a warm up to the experience that is waiting. **Western Adventures will pick you up from the bus stop at Brush Creek & Hwy 82. Tours start at 9:00 AM. Cost: \$280 Single Sled/ \$175 per person double sled.**

What Should I Wear? Dress in warm layers finishing with a warm outer jacket, good quality ski or wool socks, warm hat, toasty gloves and fleece-lined boots. There will be equipment available for people who do not have warm enough clothing of their own. Please bring ski goggles or protective sunglasses.

Insurance: Snowmobiling insurance does not include collision damage for machines. Any damage that occurs to the snowmobiles will have to be paid for out of pocket. Individual credit cards must be posted as a damage deposit. A company credit card covering the entire group may also be used for the damage deposit. Each guest will be required to sign a lease/rental/liability waiver at the time of departure as is required by the USFS.

Hot Air Balloon Rides

There is no better way to view the spectacular scenery of the majestic Rocky Mountains than from a hot air balloon. Watch the sun rise over the Elk Mountains while floating above the landscape. Space is limited. **Your hotel pick-up will be at around 7:00 am. We will try and confirm with you by cell phone or room message the night before, but this is a confirmed reservation. Cost: \$245 adult/ \$175 child (6-12). Pilot gratuities have not been included.**

What Should I Wear? Dress in warm layers. Don't forget a warm hat, gloves and jacket.

What Should I Bring? Please bring a camera and ample film if desired and protective sunglasses.

Winter Fly Fishing

Fly Fishing for wild trout in the unspoiled waters of Western Colorado is an unforgettable experience not to be missed. The Aspen/Snowmass area, with the Roaring Fork and Frying Pan Rivers at its back door, is the center of the finest wild trout fishing in Western Colorado. Both rivers are designated as Gold Medal Rivers by the Colorado Department of Wildlife. Morning and afternoon time slots are available. During the coldest months, we suggest a trip from 11 AM - 3 PM. **Cost: \$220 per angler, with two anglers per guide, includes your equipment, flies, license, and gratuity. If only one person, the cost is \$350. We reserve the right to put three people with a guide in case of an uneven number.**

What Should I Wear? Full waders and boots are provided. Dress in layers with a t-shirt, long shirt, pants and a jacket that offers easy mobility. You may want a pair of flexible gloves during the colder months. A brimmed hat, and sunscreen, and polarized sunglasses are recommended.

Aspen Mountain Backcountry Powder Tour

An Aspen Backcountry Powder Tour averages over 10,000 vertical feet of ungroomed wilderness skiing or boarding in an expanse of 1,100 acres that features open bowls, meadows and glades. Two guides and a driver lead each 12 person snowcat group, selecting terrain according to daily snow conditions and the group's skill level. A hearty lunch is served in a cozy, wood stove heated cabin set in the heart of the picturesque Elk Mountains. Snacks and drinks are provided in the cat throughout the day. **Trip meets at the base of the Aspen gondola at 8:15 AM. Cost: \$399 per person. Includes lift ticket, but you must provide your own ski or board equipment. Guide gratuity has not been included.**

Dog Sled Trip & Lunch

Be a part of the largest sled team in the Country! Experience a scenic and exciting dog sled trip through the surrounding wilderness of the Snowmass/Aspen area at Krabloonik, which means "big eyebrows" and is the Eskimo term for "white man." This unique tour will include a two-hour, 12-mile sled ride controlled by an experienced musher and pulled by 12 Alaskan Sled Dogs. **Trips start at either 8:30 AM or 12:30 PM and include a gourmet, 3 course meal of wild game. See the Silvertree Bell stand for a transfer. Cost: \$285 adult/ \$185 children 3-8. Musher & server gratuities have not been included.**

What Should I Wear? We'll provide you with an Eskimo coat and boots. Don't forget a warm hat, and gloves.
What Should I Bring? You don't want to come without your camera!

***P*aragliding**

There is no better place to soar than off of Aspen or Snowmass Mountain. All flights are tandem with an experienced USHGA Certified Pilot. No prior experience is necessary. This unique sensation of free flight and breathtaking panoramic view is unforgettable. Most flights occur on Snowmass Mountain and depart from the top of the Sam's Knob lift every hour on the hour from 9:00 AM – 2:00 PM. A typical flight lasts from twenty to forty minutes depending on conditions. **COST: \$225 and does NOT include lift ticket or guide gratuity.**

What Should I Wear? AM flight wear ski clothes warm, sturdy boot. Snowmass flights requires skis. Sunscreen and eye coverings are recommended.

***S*cenic Driving Tour**

Find out what makes Aspen what it is today through learning about its past. Options for this trip include: viewing lower Independence Pass; an architectural look at the beautiful West End Victorian homes; visiting the historic buildings and original ski lifts; the expansive views from Red Mountain; a drive to the ghost town of Ashcroft, downtown Aspen or Owl Creek to Snowmass Village. Tour includes transportation. **Trips depart at 8:30 AM or 1:00 PM. Cost: \$90per person with a minimum of 4 people/ \$315 for a private group of 1-3 guests. The cost does not include a guide gratuity.**
